“Why Should The Work Cease?” conclusion

Nehemiah 6:1-9

Now it came to pass when Sanballat, and Tobiah, and Geshem the Arabian, and the rest of our enemies, heard that I had builded the wall, and that there was no breach left therein; (though at that time I had not set up the doors upon the gates;) 2That Sanballat and Geshem sent unto me, saying, Come, let us meet together in some one of the villages in the plain of Ono. But they thought to do me mischief. 3And I sent messengers unto them, saying, I am doing a great work, so that I cannot come down: why should the work cease, whilst I leave it, and come down to you? 4Yet they sent unto me four times after this sort; and I answered them after the same manner. 5Then sent Sanballat his servant unto me in like manner the fifth time with an open letter in his hand;

6Wherein was written, It is reported among the heathen, and Gashmu saith it, that thou and the Jews think to rebel: for which cause thou buildest the wall, that thou mayest be their king, according to these words. 7And thou hast also appointed prophets to preach of thee at Jerusalem, saying, There is a king in Judah: and now shall it be reported to the king according to these words. Come now therefore, and let us take counsel together. 8Then I sent unto him, saying, There are no such things done as thou sayest, but thou feignest them out of thine own heart. 9For they all made us afraid, saying, Their hands shall be weakened from the work, that it be not done. Now therefore, O God, strengthen my hands.

We have already seen that the enemy has tried to halt the work of Nehemiah. The same is true for us. When we do the work of the Lord the enemy will try to distract us, when that doesn't work he will plant his feet and do all he can to make us give up and quit!

A. The Consistency Of Our Enemy – verse 4 - Yet they sent unto me four times after this sort; and I answered them after the same manner. After they came the first time and it didn't work, they came back four more times. What a picture of Satan. He never stops; he continues to throw things our way to make us weary in the battle. He is extremely consistent! You have heard of fighting fire with fire. We must fight the Devil's consistency with consistency. Jesus experienced the consistency of Satan - Matthew 4:3-10

B. The Cunningness Of Our Enemy – verses 5-7 - Then sent Sanballat his servant unto me in like manner the fifth time with an open letter in his hand; 6Wherein was written, It is reported among the heathen, and Gashmu saith it, that thou and the Jews think to rebel: for which cause thou buildest the wall, that thou mayest be their king, according to these words. 7And thou hast also appointed prophets to preach of thee at Jerusalem, saying, There is a king in Judah: and now shall it be reported to the king according to these words. Come now therefore, and let us take counsel together. This letter—accusing Nehemiah of attempting to rebel against Persia and set up a separate state—was made public; It was designed to discourage those who were working on the wall. It accused Nehemiah of wanting to become king. When distraction and consistency doesn't work, Satan will try to use a threat against us. He will attempt to make us fear the consequences of going against him. Everything that was said in this letter was a lie. Satan will use his lies to deceive you. He will put out all kinds of false information to intimidate you into surrender. The main purpose of this letter was to invoke discouragement. If Satan can get us to a place of discouragement then we become useless to the work of God. No one is exempt from this. It even had an impact on the great prophet Elijah. After he slew 450 prophets of Baal, Jezebel threatened him and he turned into a fearful coward. 1st Kings 19:2-4 - Then Jezebel sent a messenger unto Elijah, saying, So let the gods do to me, and more also, if I make not thy life as the life of one of them by to morrow about this time. 3And when he saw that, he arose, and went for his life, and came to Beersheba, which belongeth to Judah, and left his servant there. 4But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree: and he requested for himself that he might die; and said, It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life; for I am not better than my fathers. Nehemiah was threatened but he did not give in to fear. He trusted the Lord. This brings me to my final point: 3. The Trust That Will Overcome The Threat

A. We Must Trust In Our Provider – verse 8 - Then I sent unto him, saying, There are no such things done as thou sayest, but thou feignest them out of thine own heart. Troubles will come, Adversity will come, Temptations will come but we must always trust our provider. Psalms 32:7 - Thou art my hiding place; thou shalt preserve me from trouble; thou shalt compass me about with songs of deliverance. Selah. 2nd Corinthians 4:8-9 - We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; 9Persecuted, but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed; When trouble comes your way remember who you serve, remember what he has done and remember what he said he will do! 1) He Provides Us With Protection – verse 9 - For they all made us afraid, saying, Their hands shall be weakened from the work, that it be not done. Nehemiah knew that God was going to keep him safe while he performed his task. Where I work there is a great deal of danger involved. When we hire some one we provide them will all of the safety equipment needed to accomplish the task that is set forth. The same is true for God. He will always protect his servants. 2) He Provides Us With Power – verse 9b - Now therefore, O God, strengthen my hands. God is the one who calls us to work for Him. He will give us everything we need to succeed in the work He has called us to perform. 1st Thessalonians 5:24 - Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it. We don't have that problem when it comes to serving the Lord. He is the power source and all we have to do is get up and go to work for Him. Nehemiah understood this fact. What is your task for the Lord? If you do not know, are you willing to ask him to show it to you? If you are working for him, how easy would it be for the enemy to distract you from your service? Take your stand again Satan and say: “In the name of Jesus, why should the work cease?”

REESIE'S RECIPES



Dream Pie

- 1 Graham cracker crust
- 2/3 cup boiling water
- 1 pkg. (4 serving) Orange Flavor Jello
- 1 cup Lowfat Cottage Cheese
- 1 (8 ounce) Fat Free Cream Cheese
- 2 cups thawed COOL WHIP FREE Whipped Topping
- 1/2 cup crushed pineapple, drained

Stir boiling water into gelatin in large bowl at least 2 minutes until gelatin is completely dissolved. Cool 5 minutes. Add cheeses. Blend with mixer on medium speed until well blended, occasionally scraping down side of bowl. Add whipped topping; and pineapple, stir gently until well blended. Pour into pie crust; smooth top with spatula. Refrigerate 4 hours or until set.

Sunday Meat Loaf

- 1 cup stewed tomatoes, chopped
- 1 egg, beaten
- 3/4 cup quick-cooking oats
- 1 medium carrot, grated
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 2 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled
- 1 envelope onion soup mix
- 2 1/2 pounds lean ground beef
- 1/2 cup ketchup
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

In a large bowl, combine the first seven ingredients. Crumble beef over mixture and mix well. Shape into a loaf in a greased 13-in. x 9-in. x 2-in. baking dish. Bake, uncovered, at 350 degrees for 1 hour or until meat is no longer pink. Mix remaining 3 ingredients together and spread over meat loaf. Return to oven for 10 minutes.

Irish Cream Bundt Cake

- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 1 (18.25 ounce) package yellow cake mix
- 1 (3.4 ounce) package instant vanilla pudding mix
- 4 eggs
- 1/4 cup water
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 3/4 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/4 cup water
- 1 cup white sugar
- 1/4 cup heavy cream

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Grease and flour a 10 inch Bundt pan. Sprinkle chopped nuts evenly over bottom of pan. In a large bowl, combine first six ingredients. Beat for 5 minutes at high speed. Pour batter over nuts in pan. Bake in the preheated oven for 60 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the cake comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes in the pan, then invert onto the serving dish. Prick top and sides of cake. Spoon glaze over top and brush onto sides of cake. Allow to absorb glaze repeat until all glaze is used up. **To make the glaze:** In a saucepan, combine butter, 1/4 cup water and 1 cup sugar. Bring to a boil and continue boiling for 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and stir in 1/4 cup heavy cream.

Cheesy Potato Soup

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 cup diced onion
- 2 1/2 cups peeled and diced potatoes
- 3 cups chicken broth
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1 3/4 cups shredded Cheddar cheese
- 1/4 teaspoon dried dill weed
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon ground cayenne pepper

In a large saucepan over medium heat, melt butter. Cook onion in butter until softened. Stir in potatoes and broth, bring to a boil, then cover, reduce heat and simmer 15 to 20 minutes, until potatoes are tender. Puree potato mixture in a blender or food processor or using an immersion blender; return to pot over medium heat. Stir in cream, cheese, dill, pepper, salt and cayenne. Bring to a low boil and cook, stirring, until thickened, 5 minutes.

"But I'd rather You used me for fruit, not for bread!"

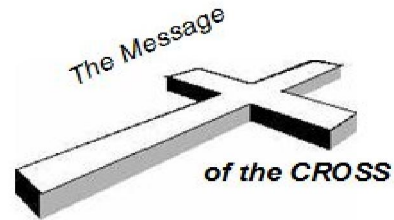
Then the Master looked down, saw a vessel of clay.

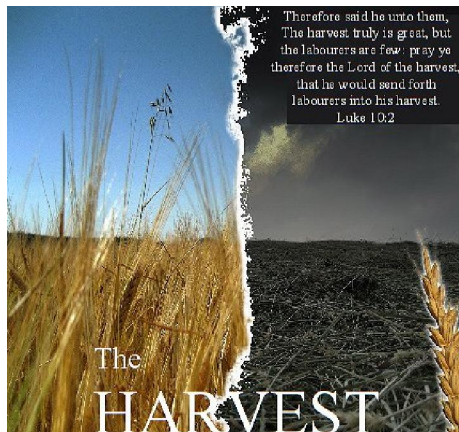


What To Pray When You Don't Know What To Pray

And he said, Let me go, for the day breaketh. And he said, I will not let thee go, except thou bless me. Genesis 32:24-26

As I bring this article to you this month my heart is heavy...so burdened in fact that I had the thought of just using another article from the past. I realize as preachers, Pastor, Ministers or whatever label you want to put on it most people think that we should never admit that we are facing a trial...walking through a valley or for sure never admit that we just simply are at a loss for words. I don't borrow from its sunshine For its skies may turn to grey. I don't worry o'er the future, For I know what Jesus said. And today I'll walk beside Him, For He knows what is ahead. "After that thou shalt come to the hill of God, where is the garrison of the Philistines: and it shall come to pass, when thou art come thither to the city, that thou shalt meet a company of prophets coming down from the high place with a psaltery, and a tabret, and a pipe, and a harp, before them; and they shall prophesy:"

1 Samuel 10:5 (KJV)

Leave It All Behind!!

Genesis 19:26 But his wife looked back from behind him, and she became a pillar of salt.

Luke 17:32 Remember Lot's wife.

The modern Hebrew word for repent is 'shoov, spelled "sheen"- "beit" ("vet", the secondary form of "beit") In ancient Hebrew script the letter "sheen" is represented by teeth and means "to destroy". The "beit" in Hebrew represents a tent or a house. So a literal reading of "sheen"- "beit" would be "to destroy the house"! The word picture of the original Hebrew portrays the meaning of the word, which is, "to be taken captive". In the ancient world, conquerors wanted their captives to become part of their kingdoms, and this could only happen if they destroyed homes. So in horror, those who were taken captive would witness their houses being completely destroyed by the conquering kings, so they could never return. From this understanding of being taken captive we grasp the true meaning of "returning" and "repentance": you have left no house behind! Real repentance means "no turning back" (as the song says). It means that the house you lived in before has been destroyed and you have "died" to living there. Don't look back, in futility, at what has ended forever. Live in the choice you have made to love and serve the resurrected King, Yeshua (Jesus). Remember Lot's wife. She escaped Sodom, but became a statue of salt, an eternal monument to half-hearted repentance. Don't let your only testimony be a longing for a house you can never return to.
